



SCE&G Quick Facts

South Carolina Electric and Gas generates and delivers electricity and provides natural gas to residents and businesses in central and southern South Carolina. SCE&G is the principal subsidiary of SCANA Corporation, a \$10 billion Fortune 500 energy-based holding company, whose businesses include regulated electric and natural gas utility operations and other non-regulated energy-related businesses.

- SCE&G was created in 1937 when the Broad River Power Company changed its name to South Carolina Electric and Gas Company.
- SCE&G's service territory covers a 23,000-square-mile area, from the Lowcountry up through the Midlands to the Piedmont region in the Upstate.
- The company serves approximately 654,000 electric customers and provides natural gas to nearly 306,000 customers.
- SCE&G operates 14 power plants throughout the state. Sixty-six percent of the company's electricity is generated by coal plants, 19 percent by a single nuclear plant, 11 percent by natural gas and four percent through a handful of hydro-electric plants.
- SCE&G employs more than 3,000 workers in South Carolina.
