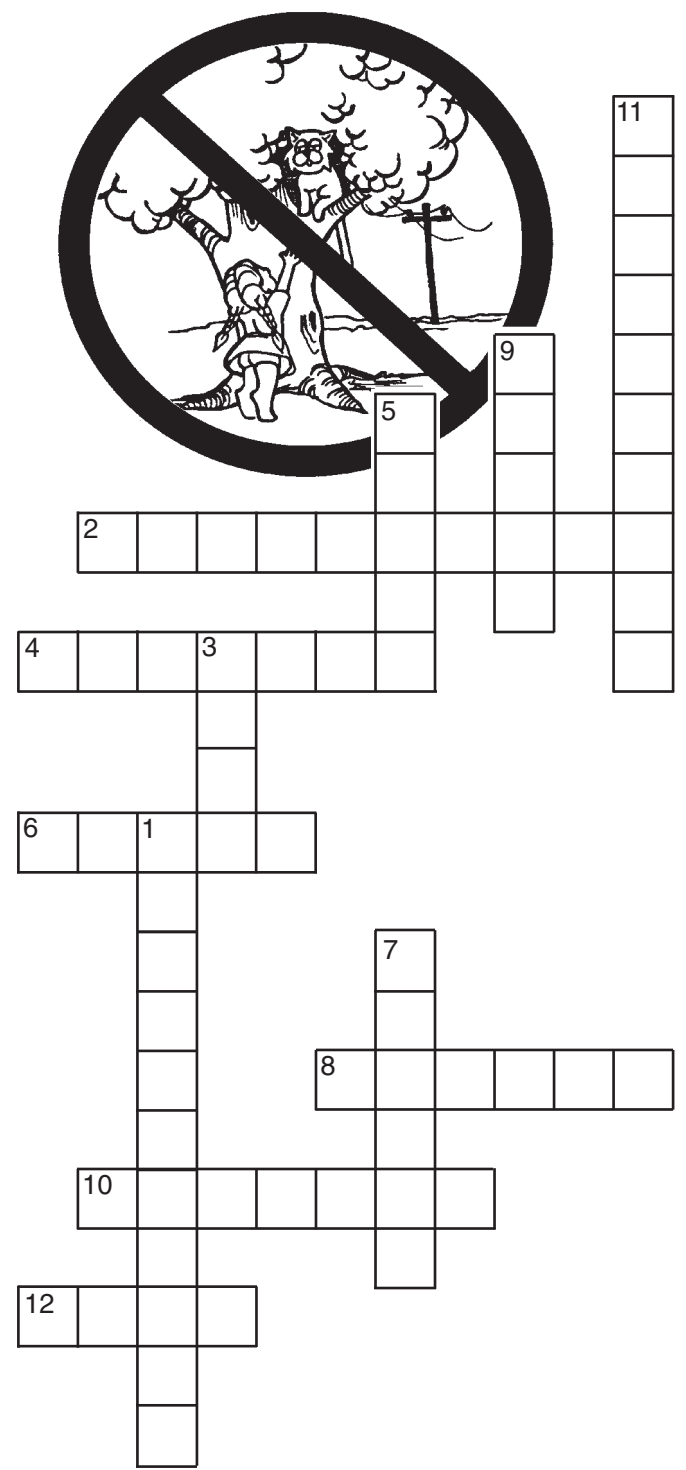

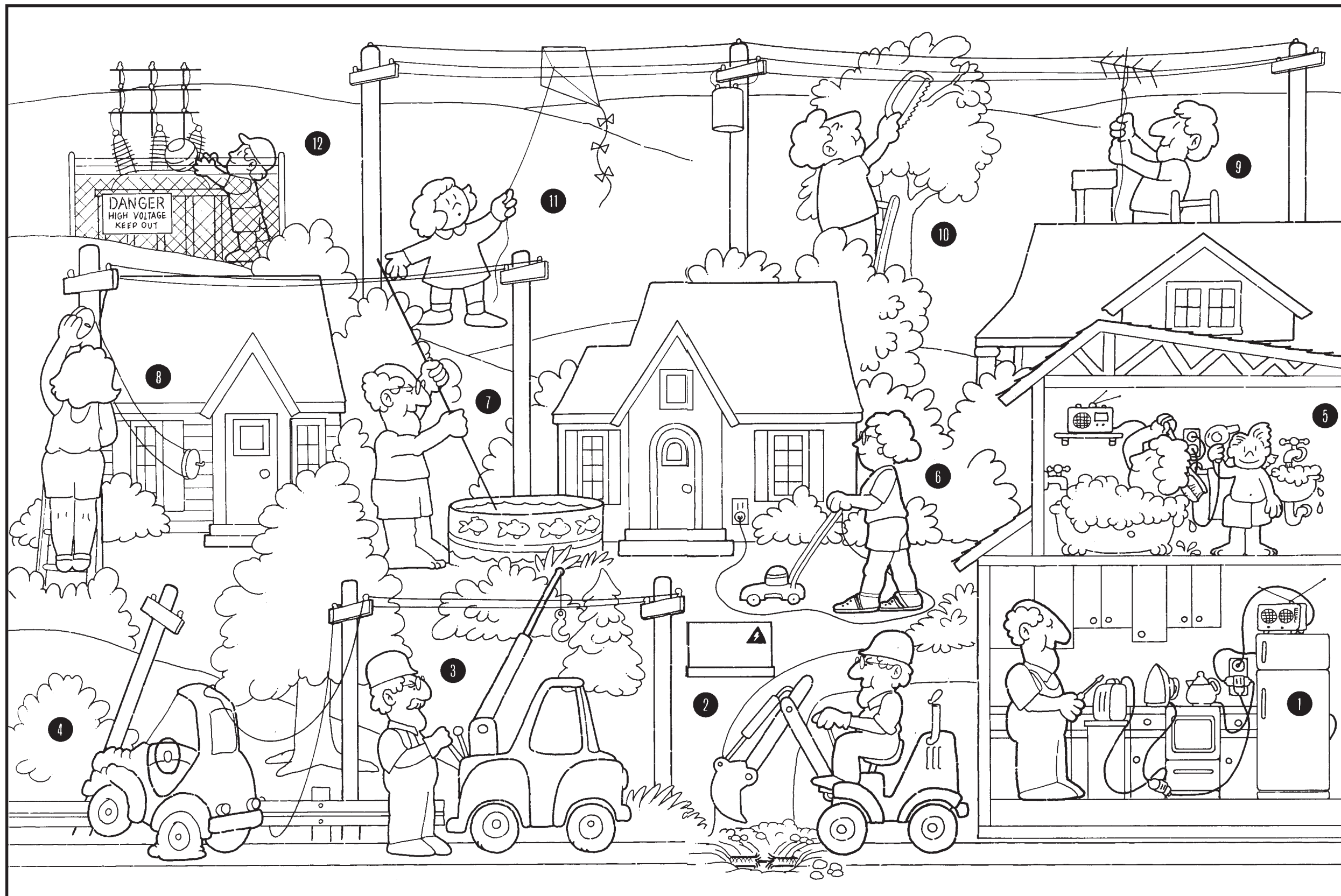

- 1 Do not dangle cords or overload sockets. And when repairing electric appliances such as this toaster, unplug the appliance before working on it.
- 2 This backhoe operator may find something he was not looking for if he hits an underground power line. Always call SCE&G before digging, 1-800-922-0983. That way you can avoid an accident!
- 3 Any overhead contact with power lines is dangerous. This crane operator needs to keep his equipment away from overhead lines. LOOK UP AND STAY SAFE.
- 4 Car accidents can create electrical hazards when utility poles are hit. If you must get out of an automobile, always jump with both feet to the ground. Never touch the car, downed lines or guard railings; they may be energized.
- 5 Bathrooms are dangerous if water and electricity mix. Do not operate electric appliances such as hair dryers and curling irons when you are wet, or in the tub or shower.
- 6 Mowers, hedge trimmers and other electric lawn care equipment are helpful in maintaining a yard but can be deadly. Take care to use proper extension cords and avoid running over or cutting the cords.
- 7 When cleaning a pool, watch out for overhead power lines. Wood and aluminum tools can be conductors under the right conditions. Remember, water and electricity do not mix!
- 8 Do not give electricity a path to the ground that includes you. Never attach anything to a utility pole.
- 9 Installing an antenna on a roof can be a disaster if you touch an overhead power line. Also look out for the electrical connection to your home, metal gutters and railings.
- 10 Do not let your ladder be a path to the ground when trimming trees or shrubbery. Stay away from power lines.
- 11 Kite strings and metallic balloons can cause electric shock or even death if they come in contact with power lines. Fly kites in open areas, clear of overhead lines.
- 12 Substations are places where transformers are used to control electric power coming from transmission to distribution lines. Never climb a substation fence to get a ball, Frisbee or other toy. Look for a ball field or park to play in, not a substation. Always obey what the signs say.
